Aeronautical Fees and Charges

Aeronautical fees and charges are paid by all airlines using Hobart International Airport's aeronautical infrastructure.

Aeronautical fees and charges contribute to the safe and secure operation of the airport. At Hobart International Airport they are charged on a per passenger basis, the airlines then include these charges in the airfare price that they charge.

Aeronautical fees and charges form only one component of an airfare price that a passenger pays. For further information on taxes, charges and levies include in an airfare price passengers should directly contact their airline for a breakdown.

Aeronautical fees and charges are made up of the cost of maintaining a number of elements of the airport's infrastructure, including the following:

- Runways
- Taxiways
- Airfield lighting
- Passenger terminals (including baggage handling and flight information systems in the terminal)
- Check-in counter equipment
- Departure gate equipment
- Passenger safety and security systems
- Airfield safety and security systems

Hobart International Airport's Current Domestic Aeronautical Fees and Charges

Aeronautical fees and charges are commercially negotiated between airlines and Hobart International Airport.

In total, the average cost that airlines incur per passenger for the use of Hobart International Airport currently is approximately \$8.00, which includes a charge for government mandated security costs of approximately \$1.30.

Hobart International Airport's aeronautical fees and charges represent only a small percentage of an average domestic fare. For a \$200 airfare, this represents 4% of the passenger's ticket price.

Hobart International Airport last had an aeronautical fee and charge increase three years ago.

Other Aeronautical Charges

Hobart International Airport's other charges include aircraft parking and general aviation usage charges. Details of these charges are available on the Hobart International Airport website.
